The Asian Energy Studies Centre (AESC) led the efforts in organising a series of events around research on governance for sustainable energy transitions on the Asia-Pacific Region from 16-18th July 2017. These events provided a critical forum for academics and other stakeholders to learn about, share, and contribute to better understanding of governance issues and practices of sustainable energy transitions from Asian perspectives. The networking, discussions, and developed research plans as a result of these events affirm AESC’s mission to become an increasingly recognised hub for sustainable energy studies on the Asian region.

Conference on “Governing for Sustainable Energy Transitions: The Perspectives of the Asian-Pacific Region” (17 July)

The Conference on “Governance for Sustainable Energy Transitions: The Perspectives of the Asian-Pacific Region” occurred on 17 July 2017. The Conference aimed to provide a forum for academics to share governance issues and practices on sustainable energy transitions with cases from the Asian-Pacific Region. The Conference featured three sessions: (1) Energy Transitions and Public Engagement: Cases in Nuclear Governance; (2) Energy Governance, Policy, and Politics: The Chinese Experience; and (3) Connecting Energy and Equity in the Asian-Pacific Region.

Keynote speakers included Prof. Qi Ye from Tsinghua University and Brookings-Tsinghua Center for Public Policy, and Dr. Vanesa Castan Broto from University College London. Speakers, session chairs, and panel moderators came from China, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia, the UK, and France. About 40 people from utility companies, businesses, academia, NGOs, consultants, and students from HKBU and local universities participated in various sessions of the Conference.

The Conference was co-organised with the Department of Geography at Hong Kong Baptist University, Centre for European Studies at Sciences Po, and the Barlett Development Planning Unit at University College London. It was sponsored by Hong Kong Baptist University and the Faculty of Social Sciences at Hong Kong Baptist University.

Series of Research and Journal of Asian Energy Studies (JAES) Editorial Board Meetings (16 and 18 July)




Internal research meeting on 18th July 2017 where scholars discussed potential research plans and publication.
